Rotary Program: **RED ROSE AWARD PRESENTATION TO DIETHER HAENICKE**

D. Terry Williams made an initial introduction of this year's Red Rose Award recipient, Dr. Diether Haenicke. Williams detailed Haenicke's distinguished academic background prior to arriving at WMU in 1985 for what became a 13-year term as the university's president. During his tenure at WMU, Haenicke's tangible achievements were remarkable including: a 47% increase in student enrollment, a 560% increase in funding for research, 13 new doctoral programs and numerous masters programs, hundreds of scholarships and \$350 million in construction and renovation projects infusing unprecedented investment in infrastructure all over the WMU campus. Haenicke led the university as its most visible and hardest working promoter and, according to Williams, Haenicke had a clear vision of what WMU could become due to his thorough understanding of the academy – "...as a teacher, he never left the classroom; as a scholar, he never stopped conducting research and publishing; and as an administrator he knew that his primary role was to surround himself with bright faculty..."

Jim Bridenstine continued the accolades for Haenicke from the perspective of his contributions to the Kalamazoo community serving just about every organization from the Consortium for Higher Education, Chamber of Commerce

and CEO Council to the Kalamazoo Communities in Schools Foundation, United Way and Bronson Hospital to name a few. In addition, Haenicke has been one of the most powerful advocates of the arts in our community actively giving of his time, talent and leadership to support the KIA Arts Board, Kalamazoo Symphony Board and at the state level on the Executive Committee of the Michigan Council of Arts and Cultural Affairs. Haenicke's contributions were recognized last year with award of the Theodore C. Cooper Award for Distinguished Volunteer Service.

President Tim presented Diether with the club's Red Rose award and Ed Sackley read a citation that U.S. Rep. Fred Upton would be entering into the Congressional Record on 7/19/04 in recognition of Diether's award. Haenicke graciously thanked Rotarians and commented that he is fortunate to have, "good friends who exaggerate and embellish on his behalf..." He added that Kalamazoo is a community with enormous talent and he and his family are fortunate to call it home.

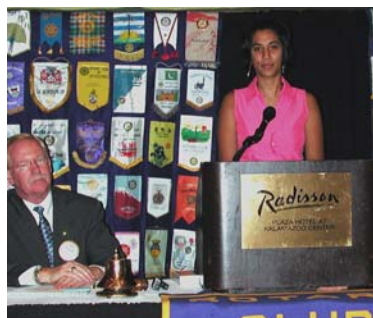

Rotary Program: "Navy of the 21st Century"

Wayne Krueger introduced U.S. Navy Rear Adm. David Architzel, Commander of the Operation Test and Evaluation Force of the Defense Department, who told Rotarians that the best defense against terrorism is through pre-emptive means, not the advanced military systems that he oversees. Architzel reviewed the technical and organizational strengths of today's Navy and plans for newly designed carriers and unmanned undersea and air vehicles for the Navy of tomorrow. Architzel added that marketing and recruitment to increase the Navy's forces are not a problem; in fact the Navy is currently turning people away and attrition is at an all time low. Overall, the Navy is planning a force reduction in 2005 to in order to provide funding to re-capitalize their fleet (current fleet totals 295 -- goal is 370).
