Excellency in Non-Profits: **Judy Moore** introduced Jan Maatman, former member of Rotary, now heading a program in non-profit management at WMU. In April of 2006, WMU plans to honor 2 non-profits for their excellence and a business for its support of non-profit excellence. To better define and understand excellence in the nonprofit sector, they organized this panel discussion. Lindsey Bay of VanBuren County United Way introduced the panelists: Rick Hughey of the Irving S. Gilmore Foundation, **Eric Dewey** of the Greater Kalamazoo United Way, and Robert Long of the Kellogg Foundation. With 9.5% of US employees the sector has economic importance.

Rick Hughey likes to see groups invested in learning through accountability and mission reviews. Eric Dewey looks for leadership, measurable performance, innovation, and collaboration. Robert Long likes to see non-profits with their “Eye on the Prize.” He wants them to set goals for sustained impact rather than looking to organizational survival. He sees the strength of relationship to the group served as a major predictor of the quality of impact.
